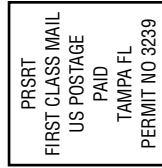

Course Descriptions

Friday, March 29, 2019

***Unique TAD Mechanics: Complicated Cases Treated in Uncomplicated Ways* – 3 CEUs
9:00am – 12:00pm**

All lectures for both days fall under this broad ranging topic. These engaging and interactive lectures will be treatment based and will focus on some of the more complex cases orthodontists treat. A brief discussion on the history of TADs & current protocols for TAD success will be given. Traditional TAD cases in addition to non-standard mechanics and cases will be presented. Topics covered will include Molar protraction, distalization, Direct & Indirect anchorage, using TADs to erupt impacted Canines with and without orthodontic brackets, TADs in conjunction with Invisalign, Linguals and TADs, TAD molar uprighting & molar intrusion. Additionally, traditional cases treated with greater efficiency with unique TAD mechanics will be presented.

Open Bite Correction with TADs, treating Surgical Cases Non-Surgically

Anterior Open Bites are some of the most challenging cases to treat in orthodontics. Complexities from treatment mechanics to orthodontic relapse cause open bites to be difficult from treatment to retention. TAD mechanics to correct Anterior Open Bites will be presented. A unique protocol for the use of TADs for molar intrusion to close open bites will be presented. Insertion techniques, appropriate placement locations, and treatment mechanics will be demonstrated through the presentation of numerous cases. A comparison of TAD open bite closure and surgical correction including treatment success and orthodontic relapse differences between the two treatments will also be made.

***Management of Anterior Congenitally Missing Teeth in the Growing Patient: TADs with Pontics* – 3 CEUs
1:00pm – 5:00pm**

The treatment of congenitally missing teeth is one of the more complex treatments in orthodontics. This complexity is exacerbated when the missing tooth is in the anterior segment, & a greater challenge when treating a growing patient. A unique technique for managing these cases in treatment & in retention will be presented. Case selection, appropriate TAD placement, crown fabrication & long-term management will be demonstrated. The management of bone and implant sites in growing patients as well as aspects such as growth changes & bone biology will also be presented.

Saturday, March 30, 2019

***TAD Supported Distalization for Class II and Severe Crowding Correction* – 3 CEUs
9:00am – 12:00pm**

The use of TADs in molar distalization and a new Molar distalization appliance will be presented. This case base lecture will demonstrate protocols to treatment plan, place, and activate the AMDA TAD Distalizer. Traditional uses for the AMDA distalizer in addition to non-traditional mechanics including mesialization and en mass retraction while using the same appliance will be demonstrated with case presentations.

About the Speaker

Dr Joseph S. Petrey maintains an active clinical practice, Petrey & Newcomb Orthodontics, with his partner Dr John Newcomb in Somerset, Corbin, and Hazard, KY. In addition to his patient care, he is a clinical researcher, lecturer, and author of numerous orthodontic related articles covering TADs, lingual orthodontics, treatment modalities including managing impacted canines, digital technologies in orthodontics, and practice promotion. Dr Petrey received his Masters in Public Health, DMD, Masters in Science, and Orthodontic training from the University of Kentucky. His lectures and articles on TADs have focused on TAD insertion techniques, TAD design & TAD application in clinical practice in both traditional and nontraditional mechanics, as well as in the use of TADs for bone and space maintenance for patients with missing teeth. Through his research and clinical experience, Dr Petrey has contributed to several TAD clinical reference guides, print articles, and in TAD and TAD appliance design and development. Dr Petrey enjoys energetic and interactive lectures & discussions that further expand the armamentarium of the modern orthodontist.
